

## GIVES ANIMALS "LOVING CUP."

National Humane Alliance of New York  
Makes Presentation to City  
of Chicago.

Four large granite "loving cups" for animals, presented to the City of Chicago by the National Humane Alliance of New York, under the Harmon Lee Ensign fund, have arrived in a special freight car. The cups, called otherwise drinking fountains, measure six feet in height, six feet in diameter, weigh one ton each and cost about \$1,000 each.

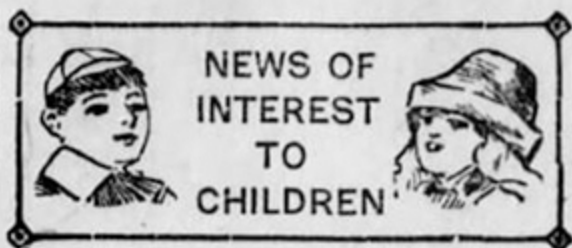
The fountains will be placed at Clark and Center streets, Cottage Grove and Oakenwald, Blue Island and Ashland avenues, and one in front of the headquarters of the Chicago Anti-Cruelty society at 155 West Indiana street, in a large teaming center.

Six or eight horses may drink out of the bowls at one time. At the base are drinking facilities for dogs and smaller animals, and near the curb will stand an overflow cup for persons.
